2014 Cono Sur Tour Congress

More than 500 people participated in the 2014 Cono Sur Tour in Santiago

Various exhibitions were presented during the 2014 Cono Sur Tour Congress held in Casa Piedra, Santiago, November 12th. The day was closed with a "touch" of humor.

The 2014 Version Tour began with the presentation of the prominent investor, Randy Havre called "Brave New World". Havre, in the United States under the 1987 crisis, founded Havre JB Securities, Inc., a stockbroker with full financial services, becoming the first company in Hawaii with direct access to the floor of the NYSE.

Then and parallel talks "Acts performed more than words! The project manager as leader of facts" and "Case Management expectations and influences of stakeholders in the project implementation 4G LTE service Entel" dictated by Miguel Sanchez-Martin Spotorno and Carlos Valenzuela, respectively.

For the first talk exhibitors argued that effective leadership must make things happen. For this, you need actions are achieved and these can only be realized through the project team, and thus show that facts speak louder than words.



Meanwhile, Carlos Valenzuela stated that "in implementing key was conducting various activities and reports to involve business and technical leaders from the pre-feasibility stage through post launch."

The last presentation of the 2014 Congress, was led by Jaime de Casacuberta with the presentation "motivational, existential and experiential Talk: leadership neuroscience". The exhibitor has made motivational talks for 10 years with Coco Legrand and conducts motivational workshop, humor, relationships, among others.

The rapporteur said during his speech that "humor is an attitude to overcome adversity, has its fair quality in adversity, on the challenge or things that are not easy and being overcome. We need to restore the mood to its rightful position."

Casacuberta added that on many occasions the mood with jokes and laughter confused, but this is not true since humor is a way of life and should always be present in all groups, as given space for dispersal necessary to maintain good working environments. He added that it is essential that project managers identify the attitudes of those who work with them, to know how to empower each of their workers. On the occasion, the speaker made several dynamic with these to show that you can work and learn with humor.

Mega Projects

AMB Santiago of Chile airport concession

Chile's public works ministry (MOP) has finally changed the submission day of the tender process for the concession contract to expand and operate Santiago's international airport.

The concession will require investment of US\$655 million.

Beginning in September 2015 when the current concession comes to an end, the new contract will have a duration of 15 years lasting until 2030. Technical and economic bids are scheduled on February 2015.



The concession includes the development of a 200,000 m² new international passenger terminal, the remodeling and expansion of the existing domestic passenger terminal, the construction of more than 4,000 new parking spaces in a multi-story car park, and a number of landscaping projects.

The project aims to triple Arturo Merino Benitez International Airport's capacity to 29 million per year by 2030 and 50 million per year by 2045. The current airport infrastructure has a capacity of just 14 million passengers.

Once the concession has been awarded, there will be a one-year period for engineering development, followed by four years of construction works.
